

340B In Action: Hudson Headwaters Health Network

Like many non-profit, safety-net providers, Hudson Headwaters relies upon the 340B Prescription Drug Program to offset some of the costs of providing high-quality healthcare to everyone who needs it.

Enacted by Congress in 1992 as Section 340B of the Public Health Service Act, this program allows organizations like Hudson Headwaters to buy prescription drugs at significantly reduced prices.

Hudson Headwaters and other federally-qualified health centers in New York use these savings to help low-income, uninsured, or underinsured patients afford their medication and provide more comprehensive healthcare services to the communities we serve.

The 340B Prescription Drug Program allows us to:

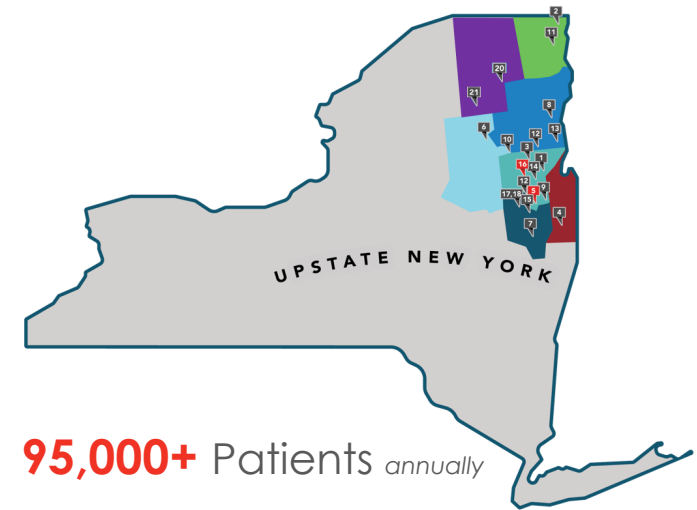
- **Support** core programs and services consistent with our mission, like:
 - Dental Care
 - Home-based Care
 - Patient and Student Education
 - Obstetrics and Gynecology
 - Palliative Care
 - Phlebotomy
- **Offer** medication discounts and other financial assistance programs.
- **Address** social determinants such as food, housing, transportation and other issue that significantly impact health.
- **Fund** infrastructure improvements and renovation of facilities.
- **Expand** services into underserved communities that otherwise have limited access to care.
